 - PVSD Music Department Update
 - Las Colinas Music Reese Copsey via email: 5 classes, total of 138 band students prepping Holiday music, Adv. Band will perform on campus for Halloween. Winter concerts at Community Center 12/7. Christmas Parade 12/14 for Adv/Int. New music stands and chairs arrived through bond measure. Off Beats: M/Th 3:30-4:30, auditions underway. Anticipating ~20.  - PVSD Youth Arts Academy (YAA) Music Update
 - YAA Beg & Int Strings, Orchestra Rene Godina: Beg. (28) started with instruments this week, Int. (20), Orchestra (22) Inviting students to "sit in" to see if it's appropriate. Moving

students around and accepting experienced players even if they are under the stated age requirement based on parent/teacher/student decision

Vincent Dominguez and Jonas Lee will be collaborating in anticipation of missed classes when Vincent's baby arrives, with Betty Nicholson accompanying. Prepping holiday concert at St. Mary Magdalen Church possible for 12/13 and XMas parade 12/14. Thanks to Betty Weyek for auto filled Emergency Forms.
- YAA 2019-20 Betty Weyek First day of classes WITH the start of Volleyball and Basketball resulted in chaos. Need for attentive adults to supervise skateboarders, bikers, etc. Not following safety rules. Support of custodial staff.
 - 254 students enrolled in YAA, 648 with all YAA and school programs not including TK-3rd. 20% of student population involved in music education
 - Full ceramics (29) and art (30) classes, money collected will cover costs of class. Additional funds will go toward supplies. Very popular this year with waitlist for art. Teachers unable to add other classes.
 - Guitar Ensemble canceled due to low enrollment. Happy with successful start.
 - PVSD Music Department and YAA Newsletter Dorothy Hanchey; Karen expressed appreciation for multiple sign up reminders. Nothing needed in coming month.

 - FY 2019-20 Financials:
